1- CAT Offices:

Following its meeting in Prague – June 2005 and consultations with ITF President, CAT Executive Committee has decided to transfer its Offices from London to Tunis and to recruit a full time General Manager. Hichem Riani accepted this assignment and started on his new functions on 1st September 2005.

Hichem Riani, Physical Education Master has been involved as ITF Development Officer in West Asia and as Technical Director of the Tunisian Tennis Federation for many years. He has considerable tennis experience in administrative affairs and both as player and coach; he is a Level 2 Coach and was Davis Cup player & Captain for Tunisia during several years. He has also conducted many ITF Coaches courses as Tutor.

Hichem Riani speaks regularly three languages, French, English and Arabic.

CAT has also engaged Miss Lynda Medaissi as CAT Assistant since 2 January 2006.

2-6th African Nations Cup:

Tunisia hosted the 6th edition of the African Nations Cup CAN from 6 to 12 November 2005, 11 nations competed in that continental event under the authority of the Confederation of African Tennis : Algeria, Cameroon, Cote d'Ivoire, Egypt, Gabon, Mauritus, Libya, Morocco, Nigeria, South Africa and Tunisia. More than 40 players (men &ladies) contested men's single/doubles, women's single/doubles and team event. The 6th edition of CAN was a successful event in all domains: organisation, level of players and public attendance.

3- CAT Executive Committee Meeting:

CAT Executive Committee Meeting was held during the 6th edition of CAN in Tunis in the new CAT Offices on Friday 11 November 2005. Were present in that meeting Mr Tarak Chérif, CAT President - Mr Sani Ndanusa, President of Zone II - Mr. Johann Koorts, President of Zone V -Mr Houmed Houssein President of Zone IV - Dr Mohamed Bouabdallah, President of Zone I and Mr Hichem Riani, CAT General Manager.

Many subjects were discussed during the meeting, essentially: African competitions, CAT headquarters, cooperation with MC Concept and the next CAT AGA.

It was also agreed to organize the African Nations Cup (CAN) every year and the Executive Committee proposed to Tunisia to host its 7th edition in November 2007.

The principal subjects discussed in the agenda of that meeting were: African Competitions for all ages, Education Courses and the African Calendar of Events. Attended the meeting, Mr Mohamed Oumar Traore, President, Leon Friemend (South Africa), Hichem Riani – CAT General Manager, Amine Ben Makhlouf - Development Officer for the West & Central region and Sami Sidia – development Officer for the Southern region.

5-ITF / OS Coaches Courses:

The International tennis Federation(ITF) has organized in collaboration of the Olympic Solidarity (OS), three ITF Level II Coaches Courses in Africa successively in Uganda 7-19 November 2005 (12 candidates under the tutorships of **Prince Madema** and **Ales Filipcic**, in Nigeria from 21 November to 2 December 2005 (10 candidates) under the Tutorships of **Vjeran Friscic** et **Rotimi Akinloye** and in Bénin from 5 to 16 December 2005 (19 candidates) under the Tutorships of **Amine Ben Makhlouf** and **Achille Takpa**. The 41 candidates represented 12 African Nations: **Algeria, Benin, Burkina-Faso, Cote d'Ivoire, Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Mali, Nigeria, Sudan, Tanzania et Uganda**.

12 Candidates obtained the Level II Coaches Certificate from their respective Federations:

6- 29th African Junior Championships(AJC) & Qualifying Event:

The 29th ITF/CAT African Junior Championships will be held in Egypt from 10 - 15 April 2006. The tournament is part of the 2006 ITF Junior Circuit. There will also be a Warm-up event from 4 – 8 April, preceding the African Junior Championships, which will be held in Egypt as well.

The main tournament venue will be the Smash Tennis Academy.

Conditions of participation:

Group A nations are entitled to enter up to 8 players in the 14 & Under and 16 & Under events and up to 4 players [a maximum of two boys and two girls] in the 18 & Under event (18 & Under players subject to acceptance). Please note that Group B nations are entitled to enter up to a total of 6 players. For the 18 & Under event, only the top 24 ranked boys and top 16 ranked girls entered [according to the ITF Junior World Ranking at the closing date] will be accepted.

An ITF Team will be selected from the Group C nations who have participated in the regional qualifying events in West/Central Africa and Southern/East Africa.
