KINSHASA OPEN – From 10 to 17 OCTOBER 2007 SUCCESS IN ALL DOMAINS



The Fédération Congolaise Démocratique de Lawn Tennis (FECODELAT) organized from 10 to 17 October 2007 with the support of several local sponsors and the Ministry of Youth & Sports, its International Tennis Tournament – The Kinshasa Open, registering a great success in all domains.

A total of 78 players men and women representing different Provinces of the Democratic Congo- Kinshasa, Katanga, North-Kivu, Kasai-Occidental, Kasai-Oriental, Low-Congo - ; in addition of Congo Brazzaville and Gabon, some withdrawals were registered at the last moments from representatives of Central Africa, Burkina Faso and Togo due to air flight disturbs.

The first East Africa Regional Coaches workshop came to close on Saturday 7th October 2007 at the Parklands Sports club Nairobi, Kenya. A national workshop 27th September to 1st October was immediately followed by a regional one from the 2nd to the 6th of October 2007 in the same site in Nairobi. Both workshops attracted a total of 50 coaches coming from 8 countries of the East African region. : Burundi, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Seychelles, Tanzania, Rwanda, Uganda and host nation Kenya.

Challenger of Tunisia 35,000\$ + H Successful in all domains



The Tunisian Tennis Federation (FTT) organized from 4 to 11 November 2007 its 1st Men's Challenger endowed with 35,000\$ + H added to their 6 Futures organized in 2007. The FTT and its President Mr Tarak Chérif took all necessary dispositions to make this event successful. We registered the participation of players coming from more than 30 countries with high level (10 players were ranked top 200 ATP).

Spanish Guillermo Garcia Lopez (106 ATP) won the final when he defeated Suisse Michael Lammer after a close match, 64 76.

We have registered in the Main Draw the participation of number of African players such as Lamine Ouahab (ALG), recently winner of the All African Games, Komlavi Loglo (TOG), Oualid Jallali (TUN), Slah Mbarek (TUN) and Mohamed Maamoun (EGY). Only Oualid Jallali (TUN) acceded to the 2nd round of this tournament to be defeated by Russian Yuru Schukin (124 ATP) 61 60.

The closing ceremony took place at the Center Court of the National tennis Complex in El Menzah with the attendance of Mr Tarak Chérif, FTT & CAT President and many other officials and personalities.
