



AFRICAN 14 & UNDER CIRCUIT 2010

Cairo-Egypt leg: 27 September- 01 October 2010 Grade 1

GENERAL INFORMATION

The following information concerns one leg of the African 14 & Under Circuit organized under the authority of the Confederation of African Tennis with the support of the International Tennis Federation (ITF). This leg will be held in Cairo-Egypt from 27th September to 1st October 2010.

Players' eligibility:

1. Boys singles & doubles 14 & under Born between 1st January 1996 & 31st December 1999
2. Girls singles & doubles 14 & under Born between 1st January 1996 & 31st December 1999

General Rules:

- a) All African 14 & U Circuits tournaments shall have a feed-in system in all singles draws.
- b) All African 14 & U Circuits tournaments will have a maximum of 32 player main draw and 32 players qualifying draw field.
- c) The Competition shall take place in accordance with these regulations, the ITF Junior World ranking Code of Conduct, the Rules of ITF and the Rules of Tennis adopted by the ITF.
- d) In submitting an entry to a tournament sanctioned by CAT as a constituent tournament of the Circuits, a player automatically undertakes to commit him/her to abide by and be bound by the above Regulations.

All matches will be the best of three sets with a tie-break in all sets.

Deciding Tie-break Game: At one-set all, a tie-break game will be used for the 3rd set of feed-in consolation matches if required.

Points will be awarded in each singles event as follows:

1st – 300 ; 2nd – 200 ; 3rd – 150 ; 4th – 120 ; 5th – 90 ; 6th – 80 ; 7th – 70 ; 8th – 60 ; 9th – 50 ; 10th – 45 ; 11th – 40 ; 12th – 35 ; 13th – 30 ; 14th – 25 ; 15th – 20 ; 16th – 17 ; 17th – 15 ; 18th – 14 ; 19th – 13 ; 20th – 12 ; 21st – 11 ; 22nd – 10 ; 23rd – 9 ; 24th – 8 ; 25th – 7 ; 26th – 6 ; 27th – 5 ; 28th – 4 ; 29th – 3 ; 30th – 2 ; 31st – 1 ; 32nd – 0.

Doubles:

Winner – 100; Runner up – 60; Semi-finalists – 40; QF - 20
(For each player)

- **Hospitality :**

Full hospitality (meals and accommodation) is required for main draw players: **04 Players** (singles and doubles) and **1 official** coach per **visiting country for the duration of the tournament**. Additional visiting players, even accepted to play in the main Draw have to pay for their accommodation.

Coaches must have been nominated by the national association when submitting player entries. No other coaches shall be guaranteed hospitality.
