This AGM was preceded the day before by the Meetings of the different African Zones. Thus, and in addition to the participation of the President and the members of the Executive Committee of the CAT, this AGM was marked by the presence of Mr. David Haggerty, President of the International Tennis Federation (ITF) as well as several executives of the ITF Development Department.



All items on the agenda were presented and discussed, mainly: the approval of the 2017 AGM Minutes, discussion and unanimous approval of the 2017 financial report; Annual report of the President of the CAT and the annual report of its activities.
